The FSDR has developed rapidly since 2016. This poster shows the key concepts and best practices that have made the FSDR so successful.

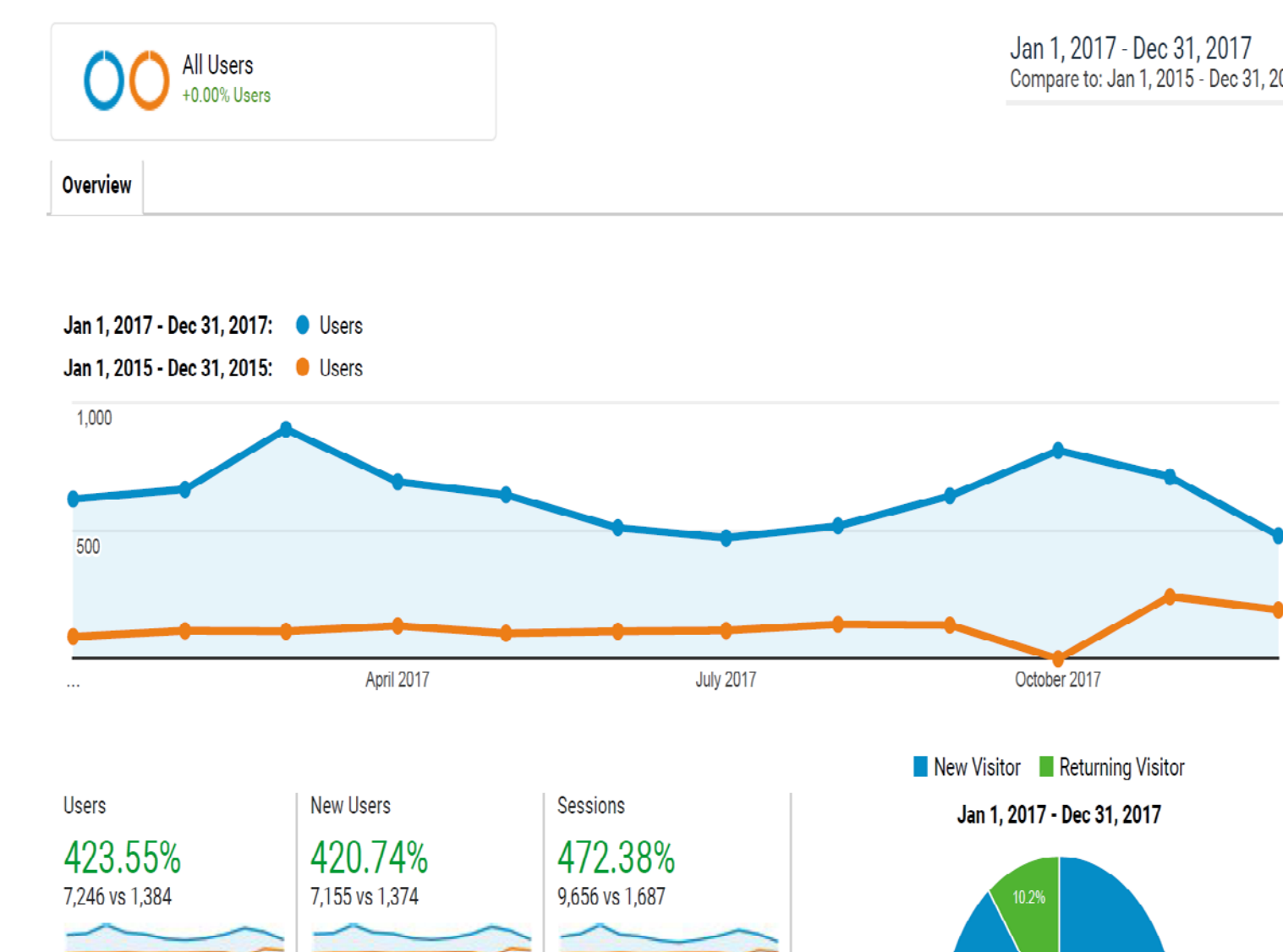

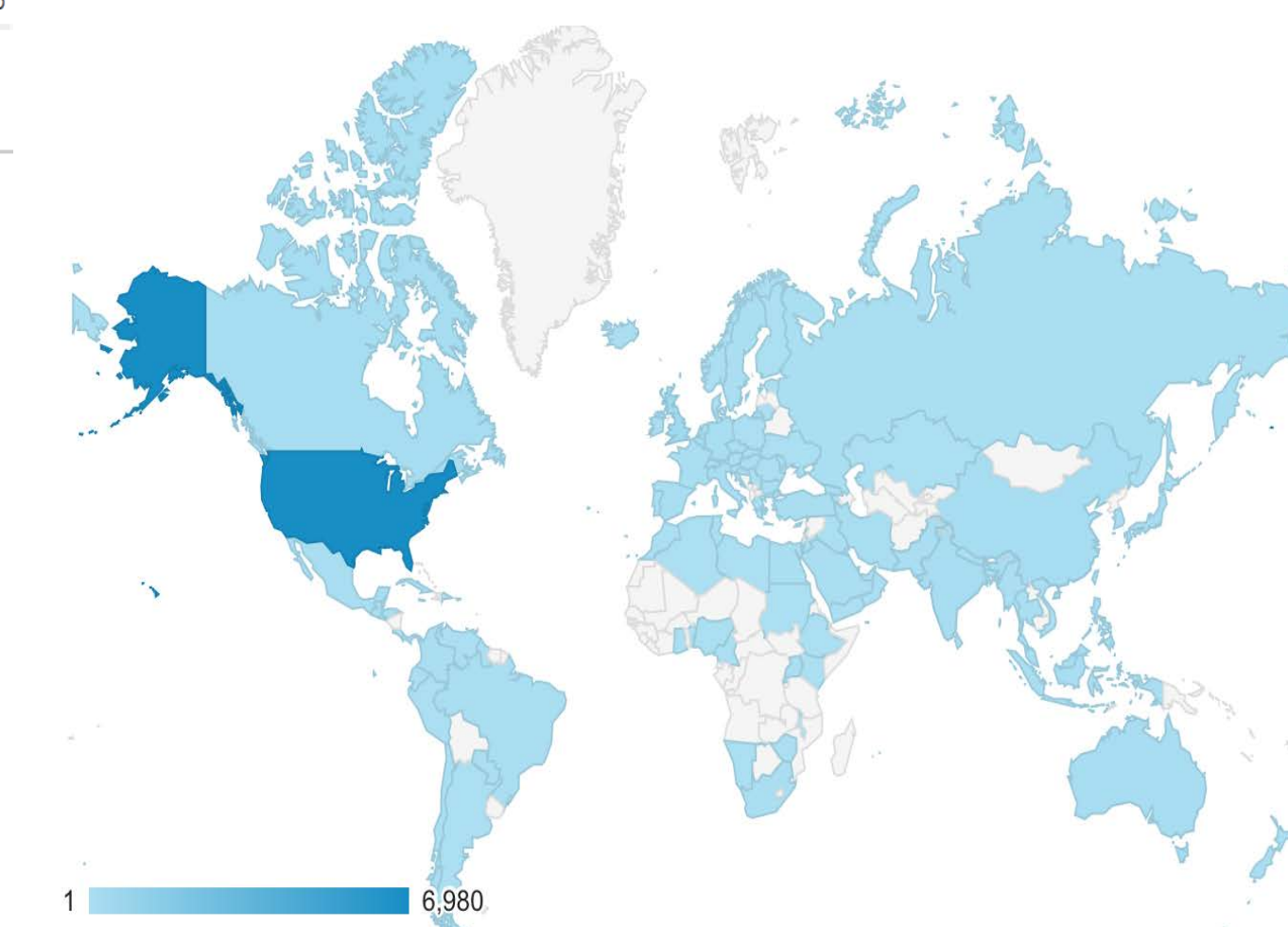
How was FSDR used since 2016?

Where are our users?

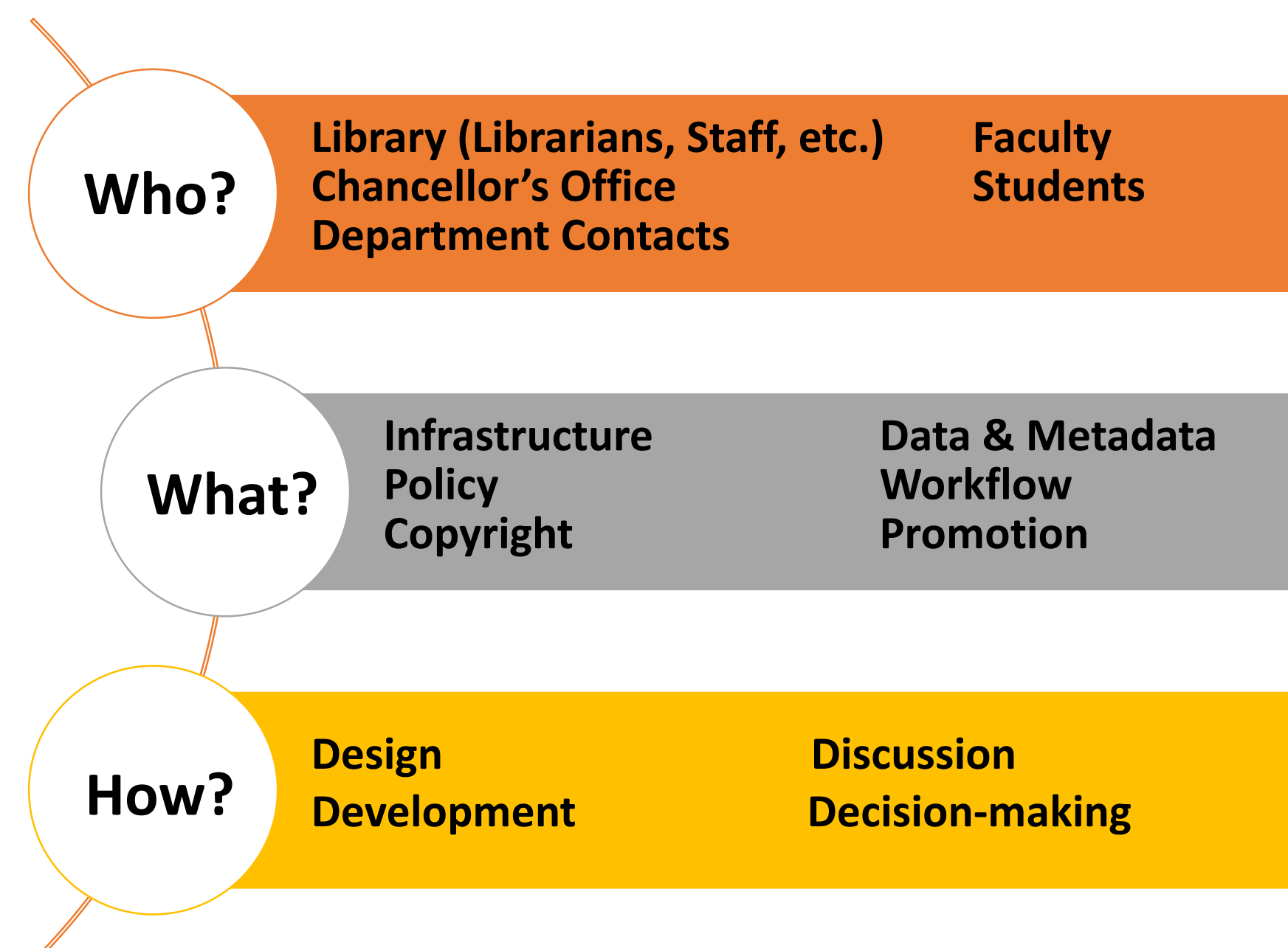
