

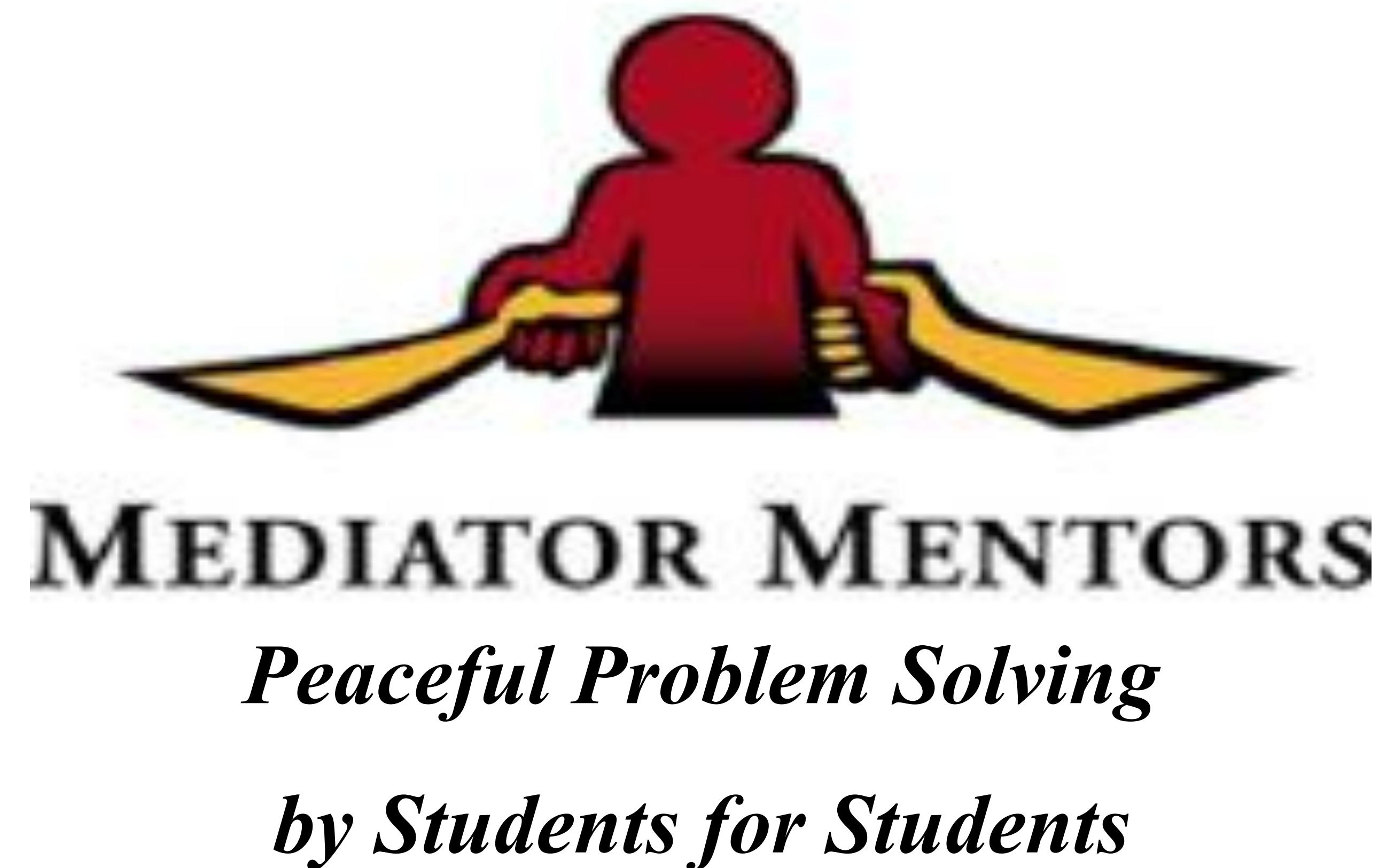
# Mediator Mentors Program
