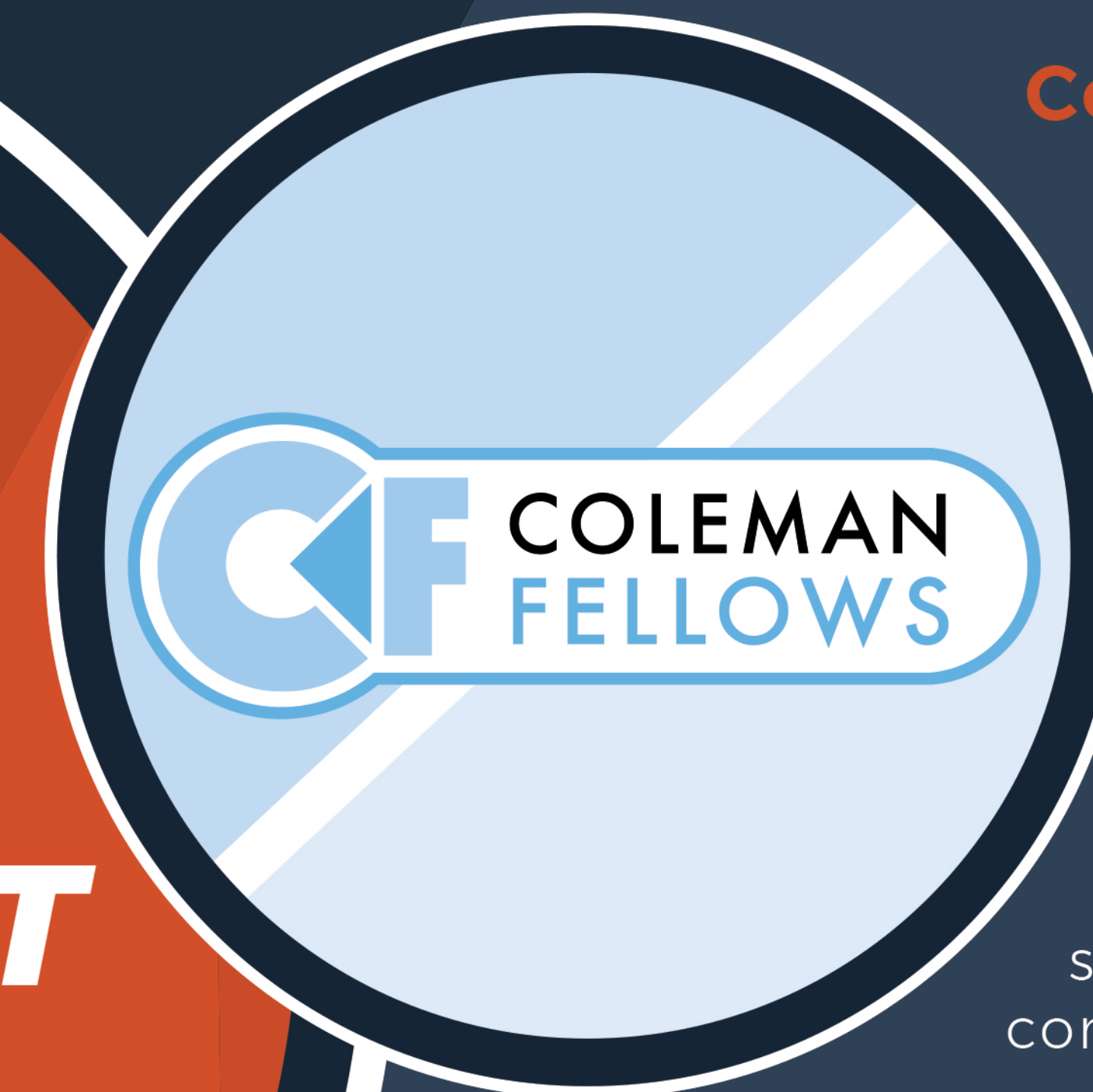
## Pay It Forward Luncheon Series

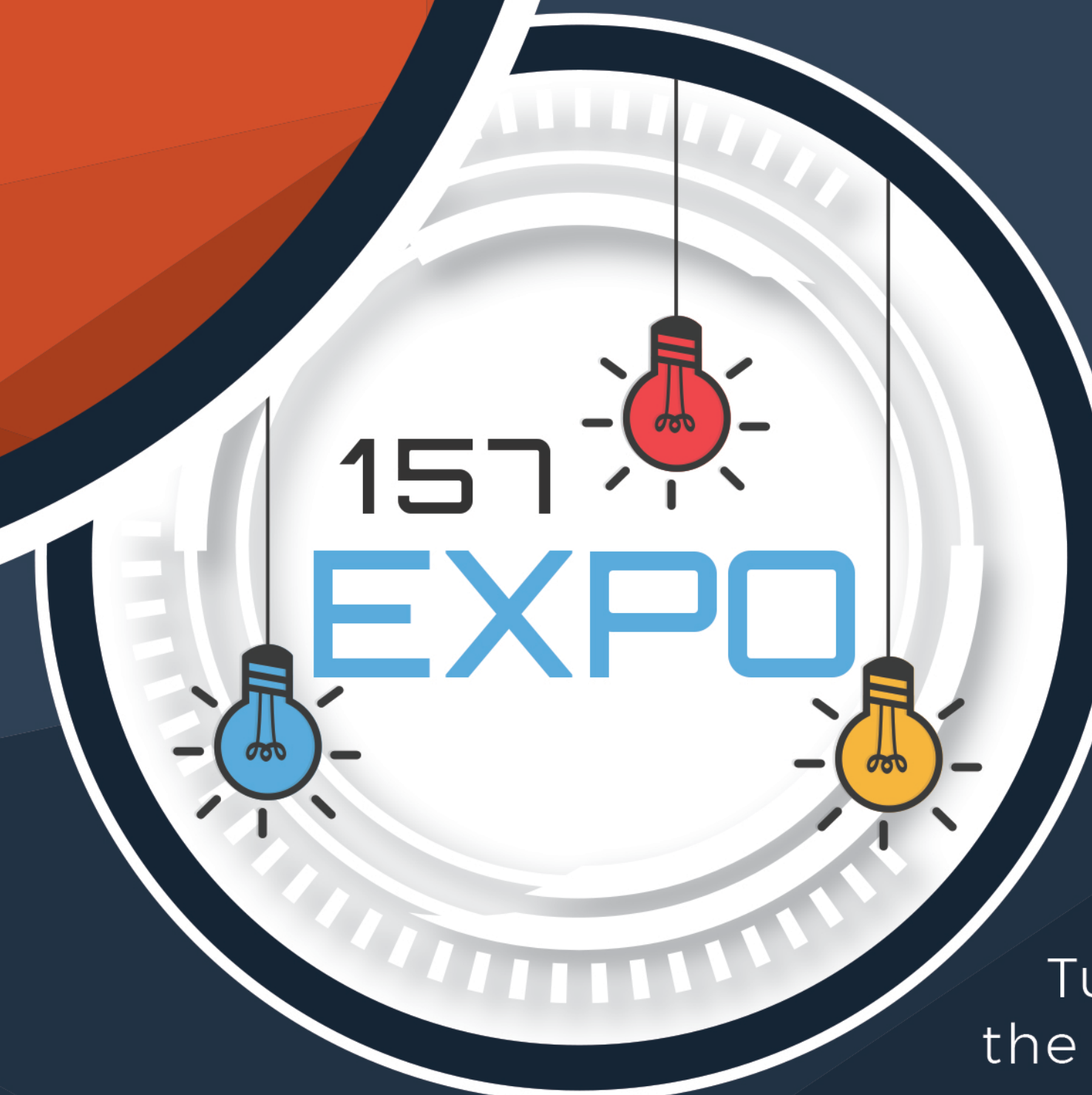
## Student Hatchery
