MentorU




MentorU is a transitional program serving first-year students with their academic and professional endeavors at Fresno State. In partnership with University 1, first-year students are paired with a peer mentor both in and out of the classroom. The mentoring relationship helps foster a sense of belonging through workshops, social activities, and mentorship meetings.

What MentorU offers:

- 10-12 Workshops per semester with campus partners including the Money Management Center, Financial Aid, Career Development Center, and the Learning Center
- Common Read Program: Each student receives a professional development book such as Clifton Strengths for Students and a supplemental read with peer lead workshops to discuss the selected books throughout the semester
- Participation in the EDGE Challenge Ropes Course in the Fall semester
- 1:1 meetings w/peer mentor and weekly e-mails including upcoming workshops and campus happenings
