Sexual Health at Fresno State: A Unique Partnership with a Community Based Organization

In 2017, Fresno State received a grant from the Central Valley Community Foundation to contract with Fresno Barrios Unidos to provide Comprehensive Sex Education to students on campus.

Results!

- Created the KISS Peer Health Education Program
- 2,000 students reached through interactive activities on campus
- 1,039 students reached through presentations in their classrooms
- 116 students received confidential, one-on-one birth control and sexually transmitted infection education by a FBU Health Educator at the SHCC
- 700 students received FREE chlamydia testing (8% of students tested positive)
- Decreased provider time spent on sexual health education which allowed them to see more patients and increase access to other services
