## Problem:

Transportation issues to existing clinics

## The mobile health program has three goals;

- 1. Provide preventative health screenings, and education services to underserved populations.
- 2. Provide clinical training sites for nursing students
- 3. Provide an opportunity for interprofessional collaboration amongst students at Fresno State University.
