

Event Participation Planning

- 21 students from the Class of 2020, over the course of the Fall 2018 semester, 8/1/2018 12/31/2018.
- Overall prompting ratios, multiple scores per portion of the skillset and per student. Four prompting ratios: overall independence, verbal prompting, other prompting, and non-compliance.
- 186 scores across seven (7) portions of the skillset

Prompt Ratios in Event Participation Planning Skillset




Overview: Our students learn to plan and carry out activity events. Activity events are important for students to engage in for enjoyment purposes, to experience something new, celebrate a special occasion, and, most importantly, to socialize with their peers. These skills seem important for anybody attending post-secondary education to maintain a social life.

Programming: Event Participation Planning is used to support students in planning to participate in activity events. Event Finalization is the follow-up tool to support students in finalizing their plans and adequately preparing for participating in an activity event. Event Participation Assessment is used to assess the results of the planning and follow-up on the actual activity event.

- 17 students from the Class of 2020, over the course of the Fall 2018 semester, 8/1/2018 – 12/31/2018.

2. Event Challenges:


Students described several challenges regarding their activity events. Challenges described by more than one student were: technological set-up (3 students), timing for public transportation (3 students), incorrect budgeting (2 students, and sending invitations (2 students).

3. Event Lessons:

Students described several lessons they learned regarding their activity events. Event lesson described by more than one student were: inviting more people (2 students), more effort in planning (2 students), and personal care before event (2 students)

4. Event Engagement:

Reason for Looking Forward to Event (n = 17 students)



5. Event Satisfaction:

Two (2) events did not take place, one due to being canceled by the organizer and the other due to unavailability of invitees. Students described several different reasons why their event satisfaction may have been reduced. Reasons described by more than one student involved a central theme which was to have more attendees at the event.
