Can anyone join CLASSA?



Our logo depicts three Zapatista women, which can also be interpreted as three female farm workers. They are symbolic of modern indigenous resistance and the everyday struggle of the campesino.

The bandanas mask their faces so that no one individual can be seen as more important than the others. This is unity through anonymity. Every individual is equally important to the cause. In regards to farm workers, the bandanas give them a limited protection from the toxic chemicals that they're exposed to everyday.
